The Department of Germanic Studies at the University of Texas at Austin has several graduate student positions available to start in Fall 2025. The Department has an outstanding reputation in various areas of German(ic) Studies: (1) German literary and cultural studies, (2) Germanic linguistics, and (3) applied linguistics. Support packages normally include complete full funding for 4-5 years, including payment of tuition and fees, a graduate assistantship (normally a teaching position), health insurance, and a generous stipend for conference travel. Additional financial support may be available depending on candidates' experience and qualifications.

Our graduate students receive individual training through intensive and extensive collaboration with faculty members, and thereby develop a high level of competence in both teaching and scholarship. In addition to developing expertise in their subject area, all of our graduate students also receive extensive training and experience in teaching German as a foreign language. Many of our graduates find attractive positions in academic and nonacademic fields.
